Graduation Requirements

- ★ 4 English
- ★ 3 Social Studies (Gov, US History, World History)
- ★ 3 Science (Conceptual Physics, Chemistry, Biology)
- ★ 4 Math (Algebra I, Geometry and 2 additional courses)
- ★ 1 Health
- ★ 1 PE

- ★ 1 Fine Arts
- ★ 1 Technology
- ★ ½ Financial Literacy
- ★ 2 credits of the same world language OR an approved Career and Technological Education Completer Program
- ★ Minimum of 25 credits and 75 service learning hours
 - 12 credits by end of 10th grade to be promoted
 - 18 credits by end of 11th grade + 55 Service Learning hours to be promoted to senior status

Did you know?

- ★ You need to apply for programs at the Career & Tech Center by December 1st.
- ★ You can earn certifications and/or college credits for coursework in a completer program.
- ★ To be eligible for acceptance into the programs at CCCTC, you need to have good grades and attendance. Programs are competitive!

Dual Enrollment Classes

- ★ Classes offered through Carroll Community College to earn college credit
- ★ Discounted classes as a high school student
- ★ Classes offered at South Carroll, at Carroll Community College and online
- ★ Classes may be graduation requirements or electives

Choosing Electives

- ★ Consider areas of interest for electives and explore different areas
- ★ Look at suggested courses for Career Majors and Completer Programs
- ★ Try to have most major subjects covered, even if you have completed requirements
- ★ See <u>website</u> for course selection materials and Program of Studies


